

Albert Einstein's summerhouse

in Caputh was built in 1929 by the young architect Konrad Wachsmann. In the following three years, many friends from all over the world came to visit Albert Einstein in Caputh, including Max Planck, Erwin Schrö-dinger, Rabindranath Tagore and Heinrich Mann.

After the Einsteins left Germany in late 1932, the house was let to a Jewish children's home and then - after the expropriation by the Prussian State in 1935 - served successively as a Nazi Youth Hostel, a training center for kindergarten teachers, and a lodging for German army officers. During the postwar period, the house was rented privately.

In 1979, on the occasion of Einstein's 100th birthday, the house underwent a first overall restoration. The East German Academy of Sciences converted it into a research institute and museum. After a thorough restoration, the summer house was reopened in 2005 with an official ceremony on May 22nd.

Owned by the Hebrew University in Jerusalem and managed by the Einstein Forum in Potsdam, the house will host workshops and seminars as well as serve as a gathering place for Nobel Prize Laureates and other distinguished thinkers.
